**RESOLUTION OF THE GLOUCESTER COUNTY UTILITIES

VALVE TO CLARIFIER NO. 4**

WHEREAS, the GCUA is completed a project to replace Clarifier No. 4, existing equipment is being removed and replaced and the existing valve is not holding to completely stop flow to this tank, which is affecting project work and progress; and

WHEREAS, Clarifier No. 4 is an important component of the GCUA wastewater treatment operations and without it the health and welfare of the residents of Gloucester County are affected; and

WHEREAS, the GCUA Engineer has certified in an October 6, 2016 letter to the GCUA that corrective repairs need to be completed on an emergent basis and an emergency contract needs to be awarded in accordance with the procedures for emergency contracts as promulgated and contained in *N.J.A.C. 5:34-6.1, et seq.* and *N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1, et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, the GCUA Engineer has certified and recommended that the emergency purchase is a one-time event to address the immediate need to stop flow to Clarifier No. 4 as needed to prevent construction delays and associated costs; and

WHEREAS, the GCUA Engineer's October 6, 2016 written letter opinion certifying this as an emergency purchase and recommended payment for the emergency repair in an amount not to exceed \$29,608.26 is incorporated herein and made a part hereof this resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners on this 9th day of November, 2016, that it hereby authorizes the payment of emergency repairs to replace the defective valve with a 24" replacement valve on Clarifier No. 4 as outlined above and in the GCUA Engineer's October 6, 2016 certification of emergent repairs in an amount not to exceed \$29,608.26 to Pioneer Pipe Contractors, Inc.
