

WHEREAS, it is important for plant operations to repair this unit in an expedited manner prior to the stack testing which is scheduled for later this year; and

WHEREAS, the GCUA Engineer has certified in a July 6, 2016 letter to the GCUA that corrective repairs need to be completed on an emergency basis and an emergency contract needs to be awarded in accordance with the procedures for emergency contracts as promulgated and contained in *N.J.A.C. 5:34-6.1, et seq.* and *N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1, et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, the GCUA Engineer has certified and recommended that the purchase as an emergency and recommended payment for the emergency repair in an amount not to exceed \$30,000 to A.H. Lundberg Associates; and

WHEREAS, the GCUA Engineer's July 6, 2016 written letter opinion certifying this as an emergency purchase is incorporated herein and made a part hereof this resolution.


