WHEREAS, as a result of the shut-down, an alternate source was required for the disposal of the wastewater treatment plant's waste sludge and during a normal shut-down the sludge is hauled to the Atlantic County Utilities Authority (ACUA) for disposal; and

WHEREAS, the GCUA Engineer has certified in a February 16, 2017 letter to the GCUA that an emergency for sludge disposal services was required in accordance with the procedures for emergency contracts as promulgated and contained in *N.J.A.C.* 5:34-6.1, et seq. and *N.J.S.A.* 40A:11-1, et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the GCUA Engineer has certified and recommended that the emergency is a one-time event to address the immediate need to dispose of the waste sludge until Incinerator No. 2 is placed back into service; and

WHEREAS, the GCUA Engineer's February 16, 2017, written letter opinion certifying this as an emergency purchase and recommended payment for the emergency sludge disposal services in an amount not to exceed \$40,000.00 is incorporated herein and made a part hereof this resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners on this 8<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2017, that it hereby authorizes the payment for emergency sludge removal services to Atlantic County Utilities Authority, as outlined above and in the GCUA Engineer's February 16, 2017, certification of emergent contract in an amount not to exceed \$40,000.00 for the disposal of waste sludge until Incinerator No. 2 was placed back into service.
